

Spotlight on South Frontenac Frontenac Community Arena Renovations

In 1976, with the support of several Townships in Frontenac County, the North Frontenac Community Arena opened at Godfrey.

Over the years, the Arena (now Frontenac Community Arena) has provided a place for young and old alike to gather and engage in sporting and recreational activities. Most notably, it has given young people in Central and South Frontenac Townships, and surrounding area, the chance to Dream Big.

Over the past two years, many upgrades and major renovations have taken place at the Frontenac Community Arena (FCA). With financial support from the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP) grant, the FCA was able to replace the 44-year-old refrigerated floor with a new, more energy-efficient and safer system.

The renovations included:

• Removing and replacing the entire concrete slab, refrigeration lines, dasher boards, acrylic shields, benches, and the timekeeper's box



- Improving access to players benches
- Updating the safety netting
- Rubberizing the access surfaces around pad, in the hallways and dressing rooms
- Installing an accessible ramp/viewing area
- Installing new 'buried' mains and headers for the refrigeration lines
- Replacing the condenser, ammonia chiller, and brine pump
- Updating the bleachers
- Replacing the flooring in the lobby and washrooms

• Renovating the canteen with the financial support of Frontenac Flyers Minor Hockey

This along with numerous other upgrades has provided our community – and our FCA family – a reliable facility for decades to come. This work reflects the Arena Board representing both South Frontenac and Central Frontenac Township's continued commitment to investing in the long-term future of the FCA.

We encourage you to come on out and to see what's new at the FCA during public skating, a community event or by joining one of the leagues that call the FCA home.



Ice harvesting – A Winter Enterprise

In the 19th century, and beginning of the 20th century, these thoughts would be on the minds of local people who had to prepare for more than just a cold drink. Since the primary method of refrigeration came from ice cut from lakes, time and labour would have to be spent out in the winter cold.

In Frontenac, before electricity was brought to our homes and farms, everyone had an icehouse on their property or an icebox in their kitchen. Cutting ice on our lakes was done in the dead of winter. Horses pulled scrapers across the lake surface to remove snow and smooth the ice. Then it was marked and scored into blocks before cutting. These blocks were sawn by hand, lifted from the lake with tongs, and placed on horse drawn sleighs to transport to the icehouse for storage. The ice blocks were covered with sawdust in order to stay frozen in warm weather. The sawdust was a by-product of milling timbers in local sawmills. Some icehouses were heavily walled stone structures set into the north side of a hill. Some were frame buildings within a building wellinsulated with sawdust, wood shavings or

hay. Local children were known to sneak into the icehouse on a hot summer day and lay on top of the ice.


Ice harvesting became an industry in the 1870s with large operations like the Sarjeant Company on Lake Simcoe. The ice there was considered of high quality. Railways along the shoreline made shipping more economical for moving ice quickly to distant markets. Some of this ice was brought to Kingston by rail from these large operations.

Large quantities of the ice was delivered as far away as the eastern seaboard of the United States, down to the Carolinas and Florida. Up to 40 per cent of the ice was lost to melting before reaching its destination. Special insulated railcars were built to transport the ice. Other railcars called "reefers" were used to carry perishable goods such as meat and vegetables. These reefers had several designs to refrigerate including one method using salt and ice.

Blocks harvested by these large operations could measure 22 by 32 inches, weighing between 50 and 300 pounds. They were floated to shore via channels cut in the ice, then deposited by conveyor belt to icehouses and waiting railcars. Up to a foot thick layer of sawdust insulated the ice. Larger ice operations were mechanized, with saws driven by steam and then gas engines. At its peak, the ice industry was controlled by a conglomeration of ice companies known as the Ice Union which dominated international sales.

Still small suppliers fulfilled local needs. Frontenac harvesters would deliver ice by wagon to area villages and to Kingston. The iceman would come to homes and businesses unloading blocks of ice into waiting iceboxes. The ice tongs pictured here from the South Frontenac Museum collection would have been used by the iceman on his delivery runs. It was designed by William Louden of Fairfield Iowa, Patent 576,461 issued Feb. 2, 1897.

By the early 1920s, artificial ice started to slowly supplant natural ice and ice making factories were built. Iceboxes also would become a thing of the past with the advent of refrigerators.

Spotlight on South Frontenac The Frontenac Society of Model Engineers

is a society whose members have a common interest in Model Engineering.



The club runs a miniature railway in Battersea, 20 minutes North of Kingston. There are actually two tracks on the site. One is a 7-1/4" gauge at ground level, running through field and trees. That gauge is equivalent to 1/8th scale, so trains are large enough to ride on. A fully loaded train may have as many as 20 passengers.


There is also a multi gauge elevated track. It too runs through field and trees. The trains on that line are smaller, but can still pull a few adults. The group owns two locomotives, so you don't have to have your own to join in the fun!

There are two public events every year. They give rides at an open house in June and at the Battersea Pumpkin Festival in October.

The club's formal mission is to "Foster an appreciation of and continue the knowledge of machinery, transport and equipment, from the industrial revolution to the present day." They do this by recreating working or non-working models of any kind of machinery. These are often railway items powered by steam, gas, electricity, or other means.

Most models are based on real life engines and machinery. A model of a steam or gas engine will operate the same as the original full sized one does. If you want to learn how a steam engine works, there's no better way than shovelling coal into a boiler!

The hobby appeals to all age groups and all sections of the community. Being a member gives you the chance to participate in a close knit group that is keen to assist anyone as required. So come and visit and see what it's all about. Have a ride on the train and learn a little about steam engines and railway operations.







Cataraqui Trail - This trail is suitable for walkers, cyclists, horseback riders, snowmobilers and cross-country skiers. The trail runs for approximately 39 kilometres in South Frontenac. It originates from Smiths Falls, passes by Chaffeys Locks and along the northern side of Sydenham Lake before connecting with the K & P Trail just east of Harrowsmith. It continues westward, past Harrowsmith and ends in Strathcona. Its surface consists, in part, of stone dust between Loughborough-Portland Boundary Road and Harrowsmith, plus a small section west of Hogan Road. The remainder is loose gravel more suitable to cyclists on a



K & P Trail - This trail originates from Kingston and enters South Frontenac at Orser Road. It merges with the Cataraqui Trail just east of Harrowsmith for about two km then splits to go north up to Tichborne for a total of 50 kilometres to Sharbot Lake where it links to the Great Trail. Its surface consists of mostly stone dust suitable for most bikes and is relatively flat. Because it is mainly going parallel to Highway 38, it is easily accessible in many areas and is close to facilities along the route. Information – A virtual tour, with photos of 80 locations along the trail between Orser Road and the point where the trail leaves South Frontenac at Tichborne, can be found at frontenacmaps.ca/tour/

Rideau Trail - This hiking rail which links Kingston to Ottawa, meanders across South Frontenac from south to northeast for about 80 Km. It enters South Frontenac via the K & P Trail then joins the Cataraqui Trail, heading east to Sydenham before jogging north towards Knowlton Lake and the Gould Lake Conservation Area. After passing Frontenac Park and Perth Road, it crosses the Cataraqui Trail again twice, going east then north before exiting the township at Bedford Mills. It is accessible from many points and provides a very good view of the natural forest habitat within the township. Ideal for active people who want to stay fit. The Rideau Trail Association organizes excursions throughout the year for members. Information – rideautrail.org/discover-thetrail/maps includes 19 downloadable maps of the Rideau Trail between Kingston and Ottawa. Maps 1 through 5 go through South Frontenac.
