## **UPCOMING CHANGES TO RECYCLING**



Starting July 1, 2025, the Township and many other communities across Ontario, will no longer be responsible for the provision of recycling services for residential properties. The Ontario government, under the Resource Recovery and Circular Economy Act, 2016 (O. Reg 391/21), is holding producers responsible for recycling the products that they produce.

The new recycling program will be managed by Circular Materials, a national not-for-profit organization committed to building an efficient and effective recycling system in Ontario.

Beginning July 1, South Frontenac will transition to an enhanced blue box program however, your current calendar and materials received will remain in effect until then. Stay tuned for more information:
