

How Your 2025 Property Taxes Work For You

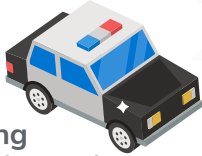
TOWNSHIP LEVY

Invested in Policing

This includes public safety services provided by the Ontario Provincial Police. **Your Township taxes fund 91.4% of these services.**

Invested in Recreation Programs

This includes swim lessons & day camp programs, Canada Day, Snow Social, and music events. **Your Township taxes fund 73.5% of these services.**

Invested in Road Maintenance

This includes roads, bridges, brushing, sidewalks & winter maintenance. **Your Township taxes fund 91.7% of these services.**

Invested in Public Safety

This includes fire, bylaw enforcement, and emergency management. **Your Township taxes fund 87.2% of these services.**

Invested in Support Services & Administration

This includes internal services such as the Clerk's office, Finance, Human Resources and Council. **Your Township taxes fund 55.9% of these services.**

Invested in Growth & Development

This includes land use planning and committee of adjustment. **Your Township taxes fund 33.3% of these services.**

Invested in Facilities, Public Spaces & Community Initiatives

This includes the maintenance of parks, public spaces, facilities and community initiatives such as the private lane assistance program, community grants program and grants to organizations. **Your Township taxes fund 78.7% of these services.**

Invested in Waste Collection, Disposal & Diversion

This includes waste collection, landfills, and household hazardous waste depot and processing of materials. **Your Township taxes fund 72.0% of these services.**

The Township's 2025 Budget results in an average tax payer increase of 4.41%.

Taxes & Reserves Invested in Capital Projects

This includes roads, bridges, facilities, fleet and equipment, parks and information technology. 90% of the capital budget is focused on renewal of our existing infrastructure. **Your current year taxes, grants and reserves funds these works.**

Invested in Capital Reserves

This includes contributions to reserves to meet long-range needs and financing of infrastructure growth and renewal. **Your Township taxes fund 91.7% of these contributions.**



UPCOMING CHANGES TO RECYCLING



Starting July 1, 2025, the Township and many other communities across Ontario, will no longer be responsible for the provision of recycling services for residential properties. The Ontario government, under the Resource Recovery and Circular Economy Act, 2016 (O. Reg 391/21), is holding producers responsible for recycling the products that they produce.

The new recycling program will be managed by Circular Materials, a national not-for-profit organization committed to building an efficient and effective recycling system in Ontario.

Beginning July 1, South Frontenac will transition to an enhanced blue box program however, your current calendar and materials received will remain in effect until then. Stay tuned for more information: southfrontenac.net/recycling

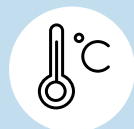

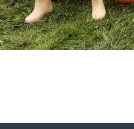
